From the Pastor: "Our Church is Closing!"

"Will you not revive us again, so that your people may rejoice in you?" Psalm 85:6

Wouldn't that be a terrible headline to see in our newsletter? AUMC is not closing...vet. I am sure the good folks of Holy Trinity Lutheran, Frances Childs UMC, Fairview UMC and Mount Ephraim 1st UMC were shocked to learn their churches were closing, merging (whatever leadership wants to call it). There are people in their communities truly sorry to see the churches go. I've found many people who are saddened at the closing of a church who may be part of the reason. They want a church for the special events in their lives (weddings, baptisms, funerals, confirmation, babysitting, VBS, etc.), but rarely attend. I've heard all the excuses...

"Sunday is the only day I have to relax (be with my family, shop)..."

"Sundays my kids are in soccer, martial arts, flag football, dance..."

"Church is boring, the pastor is boring, the music is boring..."

"My kids don't want to go" (do they want to go to school, the doctor, the dentist?)

"I don't get around much anymore" (but you see the person at the mall, the diner, the grocery store, the beauty parlor, the movies, etc.)

"The church is full of hypocrites" (except the one complaining)

In talking with pastors recently I'm hearing the same stories. Empty pews, people with excuses, kids involved in everything under the sun on Sunday but worshipping in God's house, the list goes on. And the headline above will be sure to follow... OUR CHURCH IS CLOSING!

The people stopped coming; visitors looked around and saw empty seats, never to return; the money to pay the bills, let alone do ministry, dried up; and the building needs massive repairs.

Some changes are inevitable in the life cycle of a church. Generations come and go. Worship styles and preaching styles change. Pastors change. People go elsewhere to worship instead of helping change where they are because the work is already done and the programming in place. This is nothing new. But the main reason churches close is not so easily fixed. PRIORITES! Activities, sports, leisure, relaxation have moved to the top of the list for so many people. Knowing Jesus Christ, living for him, training the next generation in the faith have ceased to be as important as the other "stuff." I guess I just don't get it. Maybe I'm out of touch or just too old fashioned. To me my spiritual health and that of my family is more important than the "stuff that has replaced it." I may want to see my friends and family at the ball field or the concert hall enjoying themselves, but I want to see them in heaven even more. The message of salvation in Jesus Christ has eternal consequences. Society today seems more interested in "whatever makes me happy." How many things that have made me happy over the years are now broken, obsolete, or beyond my ability to participate in? But I still have Jesus Christ. I look forward to spending eternity with my family (many have already gone on ahead) and friends. The way to get there is by making Jesus Christ number one in your life and allowing him to set your priorities.

The world and the pressure it brings on believers is very real. We hear things like "You don't want to miss out do you? People will think you're weird if you put your "religion" first. Don't shortchange your kids. Don't you LOVE them?" Yep. I love them enough I want them to know Christ as Savior first and foremost and live as part of the family of God. The other stuff will have to get in line behind Him! Some may not want to hear this. Nobody likes to hear bad news. But the doctor's challenging diagnosis is the first step to recovery. The Lord can revive us, renew us, get us on the road to health. Talk to Jesus about it. Let him order your priorities and we need never see the closing sign.

A Stewardship Moment Moving Forward by Faith

The theme of our annual stewardship emphasis this year sounds good, doesn't it? "Moving Forward by Faith" has a nice "ring" to it. But what does it mean to move forward by faith? And what does that have to do with an annual stewardship emphasis?

Hebrews 11:6 says that "without faith, it is not possible to please God." It stands to reason, then, if we are to please God, we need to have faith. Faith is simply taking God at His word. It is believing that God actually exists and that God will keep His promises. It is realizing that God will do what He has committed to do.

That kind of confidence is only available to us through Jesus Christ. He is Alpha and Omega, the beginning and ending of everything, including our faith. Christ is both the source of our faith and the one in whom we place our faith.

How does that relate, though, to giving and to our annual stewardship emphasis? If faith is simply "taking God at His word" and if God owns everything, then as God's managers and stewards, we are to trust God to provide what we need and to give direction concerning our giving. Let's face it — the old song is very accurate scripturally: "This world is not my home, I'm just a passin' through." But to fully realize that takes faith. It requires us to accept God's claim that we own nothing, that we are only here temporarily on our way to our eternal home.

The Scriptures are filled with examples of people like that, people like Abraham who looked for a city whose builder and maker was God. People like Noah, who trusted God in the face of seemingly insurmountable obstacles. People like Daniel who placed his full confidence in God even when he was to be the main course for the lions' dinner.

These and many others obeyed God, even when from a human perspective, it did not make sense to do so. They were aware of a principle that has endured for the ages: When God gives us direction, and we confirm that direction according to the Scriptures, we can obey, even when circumstances appear contrary. And we can be confident that God will provide a blessing because of our obedience.


