Easter is upon us. We are getting ready to celebrate the greatest Holy Day of the Christian faith. Sure we have Palms on Palm Sunday, Communion on Holy Thursday, a Tenebrae Service on Good Friday. On Easter Sunday we sing "Christ the Lord is Risen Today" and other hymns that celebrate Jesus' Resurrection. But sometimes I wonder, do we really believe it? Too many Christians live like the resurrection didn't happen. And if it did happen, it has no effect on how they live their lives. In a moment of exasperation, the Apostle Paul raised this question in his letter to the Colossians...

"If with Christ you died to the elemental spirits of the universe, why do you live as if you still belonged to the world?" Colossians 2:20 NRSV.

My challenge to all of us this Easter is to live like we really believe Jesus was raised from the dead. That will affect how we look at everything, our lives, our jobs, our families and friends, even our church.

If the resurrection is real that means our Savior lives! His promises are real and so is his power. Christians have no need to drag along defeated and demoralized. Much of society thinks Christians are narrow, unnecessary and irrelevant. I've even heard some talking heads liken Christians to Muslim extremists or even a cult... a threat to modern society. We are in good company. Jesus was viewed as a threat to the status quo by political and religious leaders of his day. He did not come with words of hatred and violence, but with a message of love, forgiveness and new life. To seal the deal, he died in our place, taking our sins to the cross with him. Then came God's Masterpiece... he raised Jesus from the dead! At the very heart of our faith is the resurrection... not some symbolic gesture, not a fairy tale for children or false hope to misguided, unintelligent, superstitious people, Jesus really is alive! If we know this, then we live like it. We worship like it. We witness like it.

My question for Audubon UMC is simple... is our ministry driven by the risen Christ, or simply a sense of duty and tradition? Do we boldly proclaim Jesus is alive or just try to fit in to our society without making waves? I want to invite you to join me in creating a disturbance in our communities. Jesus Christ will be as alive to non-religious and nominally religious folks in our towns as he is to us. They either see lives and a church empowered by the risen Lord or folks who act like they just aren't sure. Be sure... be very sure. And when you are, I am reminded of a line from the hymn "He Lives." "You ask me how I know he lives... he lives within my heart." Won't that shake things up!

FORGIVENESS MURAL

We have a new addition to our church, a forgiveness mural hanging on the wall in the narthex. Mary Tharan created this plastic canvas project to beautify our church and show the victory God has given us through Christ's Death and Resurrection. There are three panels on the mural. The first panel has a Bible which seems to be leaning against a cross. The second panel depicts Calvary, where Jesus gave His life for our redemption. The gold stitching around one cross represents the thief who repented, while the cross with black stitching represents the thief who mocked Jesus instead. At the top of this panel you will see the word REDEMPTION, and at the bottom the scripture, Ephesians 1:7. The third panel, with lilies on a gold and purple cross, shows the glorious message of Easter. When you see this mural as you leave the sanctuary, may it be a reminder to you of God's great love for us, and the strength He gives us to live a Christian life and to forgive others.
